CALL TO ORDER, QUORUM DETERMINED, MEETING DECLARED OPEN, RECOGNITION OF GUESTS AND VISITORS

Mr. Steele, Chairman of the Sherman Economic Development Corporation, called the meeting to order at 7:31 A.M., declared a quorum present, meeting declared open, recognition of guests and visitors.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING AND CONSIDER ITEM DISCUSSED IN EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Steele reconvened the open meeting at 7:51 A.M. No executive session items were considered.

ECONOMIC BAROMETER REPORT (June 2016)

Mr. Gadek referred to the EBR report in the board packet and noted the 10.41% change in City Building Permits and 97.67% change in City Building Permits (Value) from year-to-date 2015; utility customers are up 2.45% since June 2015; sales tax proceeds are up 6.87% from year-to-date; and the unemployment rate is 3.4%.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (July 2016)

Mr. Plotnik presented the FY 2015-2016 Completed Projects and Signed Agreements and referred to the President's Report in the Board packet and discussed the following:

Project Information:

SEDCO is presently working 11 active projects with an estimated \$1,112,500,000 in investments and 2,184 new jobs.

SEDCO Operations/Administration:

On June 15th, SEDCO's Economic Development Coordinator, Stacey Jones graduated from Leadership Sherman.

We are presently working with Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) Railway in show casing our Progress Industrial Park as a rail served, shovel ready site for new industry. BNSF met with our Executive Vice President, Frank Gadek to start the process.

Business Recruitment:

SEDCO personally contacted 24 key site selectors and consultants regarding the advantages the City of Sherman offers. SEDCO also hosted seven site visits to our community from target companies (projects) and consultants,

SEDCO contacted 128 members of the North Texas Chapter of Society of Industrial and Office Realtors (SIOR).

On June 21st, John Plotnik met with representatives from a leading print and electronic media platform in the DFW region. He also attended the SIOR Diamond Tour event to celebrate its 75th Anniversary.

Business Retention/Expansion Program:

Incentives & Compliance:

On June 14th, J.P. Hart Lumber and SEDCO signed an Economic Development Performance Agreement that will provide a \$510,000 incentive towards a \$5.5 million capital investment to construct a lumber and building materials distribution center and the staffing of 37 employees.

On June 15th, SEDCO presented the final incentive payment of \$38,750 to Modular Power Solutions after the company met the requirements in the Economic Development Performance Agreement, which included a relocation and staffing of up to 43 full-time jobs.

On June 17th, Commissary Express received a \$31,000 incentive payment towards their relocation and the creation of 10 full-time jobs.

The July 2016 President's Report included a spotlight over Eaton B-Line.
